Building Rural Economy Through ICUs

Rs 300+ crores are saved annually in our ICUs nationwide by eliminating the need for costly city hospital trips for rural families.

"Over the past year, our mission to bring advanced healthcare services to rural India has achieved remarkable milestones. Our innovative ICU facilities have penetrated deeply into rural areas, saving countless lives and profoundly impacting families. Every life saved and every patient treated in these remote regions is a testament to the transformative power of accessible healthcare."

In the past, patients in these areas faced a grueling ordealtraveling 2 to 3 hours to city hospitals for critical incurring expenses as high as ₹2-3 lakhs per patient. Today, with our rural ICU units, these barriers are being dismantled. Families not only save on healthcare costs, but also avoid the emotional and physical strain traveling of long By distances. conservative estimates, the savings for these communities across all our ICUs amount to hundreds of crores annually.

15,000 Patients Treated Each Year With 500+ critical cases managed monthly per unit, our ICUs are transforming healthcare access in rural areas

Take, for instance, the scale of our operations. Each of our ICU units approximately manages patients per month. Across 10 units, this translates to over 15,000 patients annually. If we consider an average savings of ₹2 lakhs per patient, the economic benefit to families exceeds rural crores. These savings are not just financia-they represent preserved, futures secured, and families kept whole.

Beyond individual savings, the introduction of **ICUs** empowered small hospitals to manage critical cases locally. This shift has bolstered the revenues of rural healthcare institutions, contributing significantly to the economy. Hospitals that once struggled to manage emergency cases are now equipped to provide-high quality retaining patients who would otherwise treatment in urban centers. This ripple effect strengthens the healthcare ecosystem in rural areas and builds a robust foundation for long-term economic growth.

When we began planning the expansion of our hospital, our vision was not limited to increasing the number of beds or departments. Balancing all these responsibilities while planning a new ICU seemed overwhelming at times.

Revolutionizing Healthcare Costs


People of Vadular are saving 2-3 lakhs on each patient in CIPACA ICU as compare to city ICU.

One the most significant achievements of the CIPACA ICU initiative is making highquality care affordable for rural families. ICU treatment in metropolitan cities can cost an average family approx Rs 60,000 to Rs 70,000 and in district hospital the expenses of ICU treatment is not less than Rs.20,000 to Rs 30,000. However, CIPACA's rural ICU model has made the same care available at Rs.8000 to Rs 10000. CIPACA has saved approx 2 lakh -3 lakh for each families in Vadalur. CIPACA's ICU services cost patients half as much as the nearby district ICU and just one-fourth of the expenses of a metropolitan ICU.

- Improve focus and productivity, even amidst tight deadlines and daily challenges.










A 70 year old male came with breathing difficulty and fever for past lweek, known diabetic on irregular meds, patient on arrival tachypnea and desaturation kept on O2 support and iv line started and routine investigations sent and ctchest plain done and patient shifted to icu for further management



Day 1 ICU:

Patient kept on Non invasive ventilator, ct chest plain shows b/l multiple consolidations increased creatinine values and total counts. From the opinion of pulmonologist procalcitonin and blood c/s sent and empirical antibiotics started.





Day 2 ICU:

Patient on Non invasive ventilator, procalcitonin levels high and creatinine levels increasing trend. Patient on sepsis and sepsis induced aki, total bilirubin levels elevated ?multiorgan dysfunction picture,. Patient attenders counselled by our doctors regarding pt. Prognosis and need of intubation. Glycemic control achieved with the help of General medicine.

I/v/o sepsis antibiotics escalated to (meropenam/ vancomycin).

Day 3 ICU:

Patient not tolerates niv, planned for elective intubation, total counts increasing trend, chest physiotherapy, nebulisations given. Doctor and staff nurses explained attenders regarding the need of intubation. And mechanical ventilation to the patient attenders and Patient intubated and kept on mechanical ventilation.

Day 4 ICU:

Patient on Mechanical ventilation, liver parameters and renal parameters resolving trend. After consults with Cardiologists, pt cardiac status stable and 2D echo shows normal cardiac function. Total counts level increasing trend and After the opinion from pulmonologist antibiotics further escalated to (Aztreonam, Mero (+) SB and Linezolid).

Day 5 ICU:

Patient on Mechanical ventilator , weaning started. Physiotheray and nursing care given. Counselling and Reassurance given to patient attenders regarding patient conditions, repeat procalcitonin levels show decreasing trends,

Patient gradually improved, pt. Respond well to higher antibiotic.

Day 6 ICU:

After 48hrs post intubation, patient clinical condition improved well and weaned off from ventilator and successfully extubated and kept on Non invasive ventilator, vitals stable and clinical better

Patient attenders were happy regarding the patient good outcome and appreciated doctor and staff nurse.

Day 7 ICU:

Patient gradually weaned from NIV support and kept on O2 mask.

Patient shifted to ward and discharge after 24hrs. I/v/o sepsis antibiotics escalated to (meropenam/



Employee EMOTIONAL RECOLLECTION Journey

Journey of her patient, from near death to recovery

Day 1

A 39-year-old woman was admitted after a road accident caused by a bike skidding. At 3:45 p.m., she was drowsy (GCS 13/15) with right forearm swelling and normal extremity movement. Diagnosed with TBI, acute subdural hematoma, temporal bone fracture, and contusions, she received IV fluids, medications, head elevation, and monitoring, with a neurosurgical consult planned.

"Seeing her lying there, drowsy and injured, broke my heart. A woman full of life, now battling the aftermath of a tragic accident. Her swollen arm, the silent pain in her eyes—it was unbearable. I felt helpless yet determined, praying our care would bring her back to her loved ones".

Day 2



The patient remained drowsy with no GCS improvement. A follow-up CT scan assessed brain injuries, and Foley catheterization was done for fluid monitoring. She continued on IV fluids with daily electrolyte checks. Her family appreciated the ICU team's attentive care and expressed satisfaction with the treatment provided.



Day 3

The patient showed signs of improvement with a stable GCS of 13/15. A soft diet was introduced, IV fluids reduced, and physiotherapy started twice daily. A potassium imbalance was corrected, and her family remained engaged and satisfied with her progress.

"As she started improving, I told her relatives each small step-her stable GCS, first soft meal, and therapy—felt like a victory. Her family's relief made our efforts truly rewarding".



Day 4

The patient's condition improved, with GCS rising to 14/15. She transitioned to a normal diet, and a repeat CT scan assessed her recovery. Physiotherapy and neurological checks continued, while open communication strengthened her family's trust and satisfaction.

"Her regain strength was truly uplifting and her improved GCS, normal diet, steady recovery felt like a triumph. Each small step—her stable GCS, first soft meal, and therapy—felt like a victory. Her family's relief made our efforts truly rewarding".

Day 5



The patient's recovery progressed with improved mobility and ongoing physiotherapy. Her vitals remained stable, and assessments showed steady progress. Grateful for the ICU team's compassionate care, her family contributed to a positive healing environment.

"Seeing her regain strength and mobility was deeply fulfilling. Every step forward felt like a shared victory. Her family's gratitude reminded me why compassionate care matters in a patient's healing journey".

Day 6

The patient showed remarkable improvement with a stable GCS of 14/15. Foley catheter removal and constipation management were successful, and her mobilization progressed smoothly. She expressed growing confidence and appreciation for the ICU staff's care.



Day 7

Patient with a GCS of 14/15 and stable vitals, was transferred to the general ward after seven days of steady recovery. Her family praised the ICU team's professional and compassionate care, highlighting the importance of timely interventions and teamwork in her successful recovery journey.

A Stage for Heroes: The Talent Hunt


